Narrative Report

I am a practicing pediatric psychiatrist with the Cambridge Health Alliance hospital system. I have special interest in community psychiatry and the advantages that education, access, and creative therapeutic modalities offer toward improved healthcare for disadvantaged psychiatric patients. In my role as the Director of Community Minority Affairs I orchestrated the adoption of a community-based program which increased awareness of and access to mental health services, called Reaching Out About Depression into the hospital system. This program is now in its ninth year empowering low income women in their movement back to health and aiding them in managing the consequences of depression. I spend fifteen percent of my time dedicated to teaching, eighty percent of my time spent in direct clinical service and five percent of my time engaged in committee appointments, programmatic review, and supportive professional duties (such as mentoring).

Through clinical teaching and practice, patient education, service, writing and presentations I have sharpened my professional identity as a community educator and teaching physician. In my clinical practice I have successfully engaged many patients through mental health clinics, school setting consultations, family mental health practice, as well as, the nontraditional settings of churches and recreational forums. I currently serve as Medical Director of a community clinic and oversee the care of nearly 300 patients through my hospital and community practices. My mission in practice is to encourage the achievement of optimal mental health even in the face of mental illness.

Concurrent with my clinical practice has been my devotion to teaching. The Community and Culture Course that I run for Second Year Child and Adolescent Psychiatry Fellows is one anchor of my professional achievements in education in training for Harvard Medical School around disadvantaged care. I also run the Introduction to Child Psychiatry Course for rotating 3rd year Harvard Medical School students and have received An Excellence in Teaching Award in 2011 related to this course. As well, I conduct a monthly Pediatric Psychiatry Review for public school social workers in my role as school consultant and have appeared on numerous panels,

continuing education forums, and lay speaking engagements as efforts to promote education of mental health.

The hallmark of my work as a physician has been leveraged particularly by my draw to reduction of disparities in mental illness through advancing increased access and successful stakeholder collaborations. In addition to my formal hospital roles, I have also sat on city healthcare boards advised community leaders in my aim to educate about the approach to assessing and delivering mental healthcare that effectively benefits the less advantaged. My efforts to date capture my devotion to this objective, and I look forward to the next years marking my distinction in this work.
